# New Michigan Child Restraining Law

The new Michigan Child Restraint Law went into effect on July 1, 2008. It requires the use of approved booster seats for children who are both:

- Under eight years old and
- Less than four feet nine inches tall.

This new law extends the current requirement of car seats for children under age four to include older children. It allows officers to stop a driver for that violation alone and a ticket can be issued for each improperly restrained child. Violators will face a fine of up to \$65.

Research has shown that the risk of injury for children ages 4-8 is reduced by 59 percent when using a booster seat and seat belt, versus a seat belt alone. Michigan joins 43 other states by adopting an expanded child passenger safety law. States that have passed similar laws have seen child restraint use increase dramatically. # Elementary Dress Code

# Communicable Disease and Pest Policy

In keeping with the Michigan School Head Lice
Prevention and Control Policy, a section of the
elementary student handbook regarding lice, states that
we do not do pre-planned "all school" head lice checks.
Any student with live lice may remain in school until
the end of the school day. Children will be allowed to
ride the school bus home. Immediate treatment at home
is advised. The student will be readmitted to school
after treatment and examination. If, upon examination,
school personnel find no live lice on the child, the child
may reenter school. Parents should remove nits daily
and treat if live lice are observed. When a member of
the school staff suspects a child is infested with head
lice, there are specific procedures that will be followed.

This policy has been approved by the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) and the Michigan Department of Education (MDE). If you have any questions regarding this policy, please consult the student handbook or call the elementary office at 644-2740.

# Transportation Policy

It is the policy of Beal City Public Schools not to allow students in Pre-School, kindergarten, first, second, and third grades to be dropped off at a bus stop unless there is a parent, older sibling or caregiver visible. This includes the student's home address, as well as, group stops such as the Weidman Bait Shop and the Jordan Trailer Park. Children under fourth grade must have a parent or an identified replacement (older sibling or caregiver) present when the student is dropped off. If there is not an acceptable person in view at the stop, the student will be returned to the school where they are to be picked up before 4:00 p.m. The student will be brought into the Superintendent's Office by the bus driver and will not be allowed to leave until the sign out sheet has been signed by the caregiver who is picking them up. Bus drivers will no longer be accommodating parents by meeting them along the route. The changes in this policy will be strictly enforced as we feel it is vital for the safety of our young children that we work with each family to ensure they are not left unattended.

1st offense – written warning

2nd offense – one week loss of transportation and mandatory meeting with the Transportation Director and Principal.

3rd offense – one month loss of transportation and mandatory meeting with the Transportation Director and Principal

4th offense – loss of transportation for the remainder of the year.

Extreme emergencies may be excused. Documentation may be required. Any change in destination after school must be written on a bus pass and given to the child's teacher and/or building principal. In case of any emergency, contact the appropriate office:

Students who qualified last year will start this year at the same status but are required to fill out a new application every year. If you have a new child starting school or are new to this school your child will be full pay until their application can be processed. You are responsible for any money accumulated in your child's account until their status has been determined. This can sometimes take a week, although, we try to start processing new students first.

Applications that are not fully completed cannot be processed. Please be sure your social security number is under your signature. This is what people miss most and we cannot process without it. Please take the time to make sure that all of the proper information is listed. If you are using food stamps make sure that you give us your case number for each child. The state will

accept no other number so please double check this to ensure a speedy verification.

## **Presidential Fitness Awards**

The President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports was first established as the President's Council on Youth Fitness, on July 16, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower after the President learned the results of a report indicating that American children were less fit than European youth. In 1963, President John F. Kennedy changed the name of the Council to the President's Council on Physical Fitness, expanded the mandate to all Americans as well as youth, and clarified the purpose and function of the Council. In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson broadened the Council's mission to include sports and changed the name to the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports.

As a regular practice, students in grades 3-5 take part in the Presidential fitness challenge every fall and spring. For them, the challenge usually involves five rounds that tests the students' physical abilities against different benchmarks. The purpose of this process it to test their endurance and to motivate the students to improve from challenge to challenge by the time the five parts are exhausted. In the five parts, those who score more than 90% in each part will be awarded the Presidential Fitness Award, and students who secure 50% or more in each of the five sections are bestowed the National Fitness Award. The five parts in the Presidential Fitness Challenge include:

- Curl-ups or Crunches The students have to lie flat on their backs with their feet firmly attached to the floor, and then raise their backs completely off the ground for a short duration of time, to make the count. The challenge in its whole is about how many curl-ups one can make in a minute. This exercise tests and builds over a period of time, abdominal strength/endurance.
- Distance Run A one mile run where the time taken by each student is noted. For 8-9 years, the distance is half a mile. The purpose of this challenge is to measure the cardiovascular endurance of each student. Students are encouraged to improve their timings as each week passes by.
- Sit-n-Run Students sit with their feet against a sit-n-reach box and stretch themselves to reach as far as possible along the measuring scale/line. This is to test flexibility. Repeatedly doing this exercise would improve the flexibility by leaps and bounds.
- Shuttle Run This challenge measures the time taken by each student to run 30 feet from a starting line, pick up a bean bag from the other end, bring it back to the starting point, repeating the procedure twice. Each participant's coordination and speed is tested in this challenge.
- Pull Ups Students are required to do the maximum number of pull ups in a stipulated time. This tests the upper body strength of every participant.
