## A HUGE Thank You

Beal City Public Schools would like to take this opportunity to thank the voters of the Beal City community for their continued support and commitment to the district and our students and staff.

Both 18 mill non-homestead millage proposals passed by fairly good margins. In rough numbers the 1st proposal ( 18 mill non-homestead millage renewal and Headlee override was about 65\% to $35 \%$ ) the 2nd proposal (headlee restoration was about 54\% to 46\%) as reported by the Morning Sun.
While the state of Michigan struggles to fully fund $\mathrm{k}-12$ schools, our community has done it's part by passing these proposals. It will now be four years until the school district will need to come back to the voters to renew the 18 mill non-homestead millage.

Also a big congratulations to the four candidates who filled the four Board of Education seats, new comers Denise McBride, Ed VanAvery and the incumbents Frank Fox and Bob Pasch. Your support of and commitment to our community and school is welcomed and appreciated. Thank You for your service.

## Memorial Hill in Place

Beal City Schools has received donations from community members, classes that have graduated, family members and friends, for memorials in honor of loved ones. Trees were purchased in their honor. The memorial trees were originally planted in front of the old high school, but when the new addition was built, the trees were moved east of the old football field. When the sports complex was built in 2002, we dedicated the hill west of the pressbox as Memorial Hill in hopes that the trees would not have to be moved again. During the moves the plastic monuments have been misplaced, broken or have come up missing.
