MIDLAND GIGANOTOSAURUS FIELD TRIP On January 28, a group of 24 students from kindergarten through sixth grade were selected to go on a field trip to the Midland Center for the Arts based on how well they demonstrated the six pillars of Character Counts during the first semester. Beal City Media Center joins MelCat

Mrs. Rau is very excited to announce that our school library has become a member of MelCat! MelCat is a state-wide resource-sharing program. Over 400 libraries all over Michigan participate; libraries that belong to this cooperative freely borrow from and loan to any other member February 21, 2011: library! Virtually all universities and many public libraries are members, as well as many public schools. Literally millions of items - books, CDs, and movies - are now available to our local library users!

When a patron at BCHS would like to borrow material that we don't \$12,475.98, Athletic Fund payown locally, we can request it through the MelCat system. If that item is owned by any of the participating libraries, it is shipped to us, usually in about 5 - 7 days! Our patrons have a 21 day loan period and we then have a Education rate to \$320.00 5-7 day period to ship the item back.

Luckily, our local REMC has underwritten the expenses involved in this program. Beal City is already a REMC member, and we are able to participate at no additional expense to the district!

Students and staff interested in reading books that we don't own locally should see Mrs. Rau in the Media Center to learn more.
