

The Beal City Baseball program would also like to thank everyone who supported them at the spaghetti dinner on March 19th. We would especially like to thank the parents for all their donations.



The following was approved at a regular board meeting on March 23, 2015:

- General Fund payments of \$289,555.77, Hot Lunch payments of \$11,549.66, Athletic Fund payments of \$7,935.04.
- The Budget Amendments as presented.
- The Tribal Grant Applications as presented.
- Rachel Leff-Ewing's teacher resignation as presented.
- The following coaches are being recommended through PCMI: Tim Taylor JH Girls Track, and Brad Gross Varsity Football.

The Beal City Education Foundation started an initiative earlier this year in conjunction with the Beal City Education Association and the Beal City Board of Education to provide test prep software called Methods Test Prep, to give students the opportunity to prepare for the ACT. In this partnership the cost of the software was split between the BCEF and the BOE. The BCEA provided support for the software by allowing students time in and out of class and on the weekends to use the software. During January and February, on Saturday mornings and Sunday nights, for two hours members of the BCEF, the BCEA and the BOE opened the computer lab to give students an opportunity to study and to provide guidance to students on the ACT test.

The students studied for over a hundred hours and answered over 8,000 sample test questions during these study sessions. Each student was awarded one ticket with their name on it for each hour they spent at the Saturday and Sunday test prep sessions. Then after the ACT test on March 4th the tickets went into a hat and one ticket was drawn for a prize of an IPad mini. The winner this year was Junior Kendall Flaugher. Kendall studied more hours during the study session than any of his classmates! Kendall told Mrs. Millerov that his goal was to raise his projected score by a couple of points. Good Luck Kendall on this goal your efforts were commendable and will pay off.

Congratulations to all of the students that participated and took advantage of the study sessions. The BCEF, BCEA and the BOE all thank you for your effort and look forward to hearing how the test prep software helped you all become winners by raising your ACT scores.

What's Cooking?

There's always a meal ready to be served!

Some mornings, it's tough to find the time to make sure your kids are eating a nutritious breakfast. On those days, why not send them to the School Breakfast Program? Each meal meets government nutritional guidelines and standards. Schools are required to provide a breakfast meal that supplies at least ¼ of the Recommended Dietary Allowance for protein, calcium, iron, Vitamin A, Vitamin C, and calories. Check your child's menu to see the variety of nutritious choices available at School Breakfast, or stop by to sample the food yourself!

Every morning our breakfast consists of: assorted pop tarts, muffins, uncrustables, cereal, yogurt, juice, cheese stick and milk. Students must choose a fruit and 2 other items.
