Student Activity Account payments of \$28,238.29, Custodial Fund payments of \$765.00, Athletic Fund payments of \$3,765.35, Arbiter Sports payments of \$2,991.15, Debt Fund 2012 payments of \$7,762.50, Debt Fund 2017 payments of \$8,412.50, Capital Projects payments of \$10,333.00 and Capital Projects Checking of \$363,623.88.

The Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe awarded the Fall 2021 Tribal grants this month. A huge THANK YOU to the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe. They have battled through the COVID virus just like all of us and made grants available to their local partners like they always have. We again did not have a traditional 2% distribution ceremony this time. Grants were picked up one at a time due to COVID. We applied for roughly \$400,000 dollars in grants and we have been awarded \$173,326.80. Thank you to all who applied for a grant and congratulations to the following winners of this fall's tribal grants.
