School Safety and Security is Job One

Safety and security of our students and staff is the number one priority here at Beal City Public Schools. We must have a safe learning environment before we can even think about student achievement or any of our other District Goals. Over the last few years, we have implemented several measures with this goal in mind.

A few years ago we installed automatic locks on all of our outside entrance doors to keep them locked throughout the school day. All visitors during the school day must be buzzed in by Central Office. This allows our staff to monitor access while students are in the building. We have recently

installed upgraded security cameras inside and outside the building. These cameras can be found throughout campus.

Another significant security upgrade was made possible last year, thanks to a very generous grant that we received from the Michigan State Police. This grant totaled nearly \$85,000.00 and allowed us to complete two main projects. First, we installed new door locks with an emergency push button deadbolt on every classroom and school office door in the building. (See pictured below) These deadbolts can be deployed in the event of an emergency situation and increase the security of each classroom. The second part of the MSP grant allowed us to put a security film on all exterior windows of the building. This film greatly increases the shatter resistance of the glass and prevents unwanted entry.

In December, thanks to a Tribal grant written by Mrs. Cole, door closers were added to all classrooms. This will ensure that doors are closed and locked throughout the school day. Finally, with the door lock project we also took all of the doors in the building down and had them sandblasted and powder coated and/or painted Beal Blue.

Future work with Phase 2 of the Bond project will allow us to have three secure entry points into the school during the school day. We will be remodeling the Elementary, Secondary and Central offices so that we have a security camera to buzz visitors into each office before they can enter the school building itself. All of these upgrades, along with moving our school to the ALICE security protocols have and will continue to help keep us all as safe as possible.



A student perspective:

Beal City High School Installs New Safety Features

Over the summer, Beal City Public Schools added new features to improve the safety of the students during the school day. Adding these features was made possible by a grant from the Michigan State Police. There were two new things added. The first thing was a safety film by the company 3M. This was applied to all of the outside windows in the school. It is designed to prevent break-ins from the outside. If there was an attempt to break the window, the film keeps the glass from shattering, which denies entry.

Another feature added to improve the safety of the school were new door locks. These are designed to keep the doors from opening if someone was trying to get into the classroom. There is a red button on the door handle. When the button is pushed, a deadbolt goes into the door frame to secure the door shut. This makes it nearly impossible to open the door from the outside.

Thanks to these new improvements, our school is a safer place for all of us.

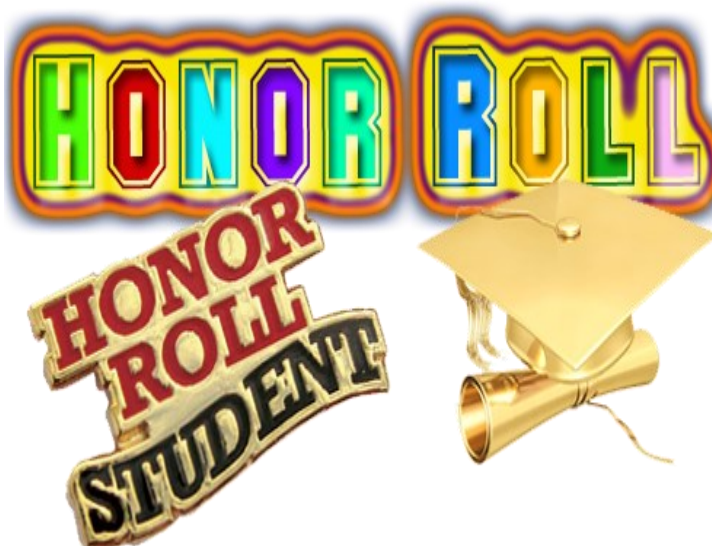

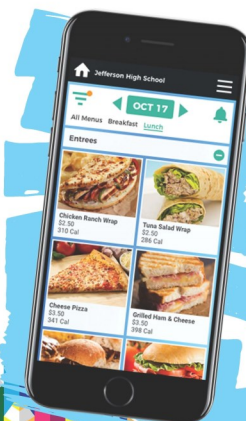
