

Did you know that one of our own students has started their dancing career? This summer, Rosie Daniels had an opportunity to dance at a prestigious ballet school in Russia. After dancing since she was 16 months old and dancing in

Rosie and 14 other students earned a scholarship to be flown to Russia and dance at the Bolshoi Ballet Academy for six weeks. Three thousand three hundred people applied for this scholarship fbut only six hundred sixty got in, and Rosie was one them.

However, it wasn't easy to earn that scholarship. Each student was required to write four essays, and turn in a teacher recommendation. It wasn't easy dancing there, either. Rosie had a hard time getting used to repeating the same dances over and over again. It was also tough to deal with soreness after so much dancing. Despite the soreness and nerves, Rosie loved Russia. "I was really nervous," she said. "When I got off the plane, everything was in Russian. It was very intimidating." While in Russia, Rosie stayed at the Moscow State Academy, and with two host families on the weekend. At the end of her trip, Rosie performed with the other students at the Academy. Rosie was very thankful for having the opportunity to visit and perform in Russia.



1994 State Championship Halftime Recognition

Beal City Football and Athletics invited back the 1994 state championship football team and coaches in recognition of the 25th anniversary of their championship.

The undefeated 1994 team did not listen to the outside noise that they were not supposed to qualify for the playoffs, instead they used it as motivation. The team opened the season with a 48-0 victory over Sacred Heart and only built momentum from there, by going on to win the Highland Conference with a 5-0 record. From there the team won their next 4 games by a combined score of 190-14 which included the Regional Championship game against North Muskegon. This led to the first Aggies trip to Marquette's Yooper Dome where the Aggies battled Lake Linden and defeated them 22-14. In the state championship game, at the Pontiac Silverdome, the Aggies rolled to a 35-14 victory over Litchfield.
