





Beal City High School Ranked in the Top 10% In the State!



For the second year in a row, Beal City High School was ranked amongst the top high schools in the state when it comes to performance on the SAT. Last year's seniors were ranked number 16 in the state and this year's group are 56th of all public high schools in Michigan, putting them solidly in the top ten percent. Their average on the SAT was a 1095, with an average math subscore of 556, and an average english language arts subscore of 539. A whopping 59% of this group tested out college and career ready!



School Bus Safety Week October 21-25, 2019



REMEMBER:

When you see a school bus stopped with its red lights flashing, you must stop too. You stop whether the bus is oncoming or you are behind the bus.

When you see a bus with flashing amber lights, slow down and prepare to stop. The bus is preparing to stop or may already be stopped.

Stay stopped until the bus moves on, or the driver signals that it's safe for you to proceed, by turning off the flashing lights. (Some buses also have a stop sign that swings out from the bus or a digital display).

Be aware of signs, school buses, playgrounds and other things that indicate that children could be close by.
