Sealed Bids will be accepted by the Board of Education of Beal City Public Schools ("District") for the sale of real property known as the "School's drain field lot" consisting of an approximately 5 acres of real property located just west behind Ellen's and south of the residential homes along Beal City Rd. within Isabella County, Michigan ("Property"). By submitting a Property bid, each bidder agrees to the conditions listed below.

#### The conditions of the bid are:

- 1. Sealed Bids must be received on or before 3:00 p.m. on September 29<sup>,</sup> 2023, in the Central Office at 3180 W. Beal City Rd. Mt. Pleasant, MI addressed to the Superintendent of Beal City Public Schools, at which time the bids will be opened and read aloud.
- All bids must include a plan which specifically describes how the Property will be developed and used.
- 3. A certified or cashier's check in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) shall accompany each Property bid as a deposit. The deposit amount will be credited to the purchase price at closing of the Property sale. The deposit amount will be returned to all unsuccessful bidders within 10 days from the date that the Board has accepted a bid for the Property or has rejected all bids for the property.
- 4. A copy of the Property purchase agreement, title commitment, and other Property documents will be available on the District's website (<a href="www.bealcityschool.net">www.bealcityschool.net</a>) or at the Central office of Beal City Public Schools during the regular business hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. All other inquiries should be directed to William C Chilman IV, Superintendent of Beal City Public Schools.
- 5. The Board of Education ("Board") will review bids the week of October 2<sup>nd</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> 2023.
- 6. The Board may, in its discretion, schedule bidder interviews and review and approve a winning bid at its meeting on October 16, 2023.
- 7. The Board expressly reserves the right to (a) reject any or all bids, (b) negotiate with any or all bidders, (c) allow supplemental bids, (d) extend the bid deadline, and (e) accept the bid which the Board, at its sole discretion, determines best serves the interests of the District. The Board may accept a bid contingent upon the County's rezoning of the Property to allow for a bidder's proposed use of the same.

### The conditions of the sale are:

- A. The Property will be sold "as-is" and other than a warranty of title (subject to exceptions contained in the title commitment), the District expressly disclaims any warranties with regard to the Property.
- B. The selected bidder shall sign the purchase agreement posted on the District's website pursuant to Section 4 above within seven (7) days from the date that the Board accepts the selected bidder's bid. The selected bidder's failure to timely sign that purchase agreement

- shall result in the selected bidder forfeiting the deposit amount referenced in Section 3 above and in the sale being automatically terminated.
- C. The Property purchaser will take the Property in its "as-is" condition and with all faults. Following conveyance of the Property to the purchaser, the District shall have no liability or exposure with respect to the condition of the Property. At, closing, the purchaser shall enter into an agreement with the District wherein the purchaser shall indemnify and hold harmless the District from all environmental matters and other liability arising out of the condition of the Property.
