

Reading Camp- open to K-6th grade students, July 12th, 19th and 26th from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. We will use 2-3 elementary classrooms & the playground. No charge to the students who sign-up. Students will be working with Reading Teacher Julie Farrell and other teachers as numbers dictate.

<u>Volleyball Camp</u>- open to $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ grade students, July $24^{th} - 27^{th}$ from 9:00 am to 10:30 am. We will use the Big Gym. The cost of this camp is \$30. The student athletes will be working with Coach Kennedy and the high school volleyball players.
