Beal City Community:

We, the Board of Education, voted to lease land to Apex Clean Energy, Inc. at the February 19th board meeting. This topic was first presented to us at the November board meeting. It remained on our agenda as a discussion item for December. It was also a discussion/action item on our board agenda for January. Discussion was held at the January board meeting that led to additional questions, resulting in a scheduled committee meeting with Apex on February 2nd.

Board members received letters and emails from the community. These questions, as well as questions from all board members, were researched with the leasing company, and the answers were shared with all board members. During these months, board members attended county, township and zoning meetings. We also contacted other school systems that have windmills in their district.

At the February board meeting, we listened to public comments on this decision. With all of the conversations and meetings, we did not hear a scientific reason on why we should not move forward with a yes vote. Student safety and education, as always, was our top priority throughout this process just as it is for many of you. After all was considered, we voted unanimously to lease a portion of our school property for wind energy. We would like to thank the community for trusting us to make informed decisions such as this for the district, students, and our community plus many others for the good of our school.

Dear Students, Parents, Staff and Community Members:

As news of the latest school shooting floods the media, we again see the faces of children, parents, and school staff shocked by another school tragedy. This time we see terrified children and hear gun shots as teens capture the event live on social media. We cannot accept these tragedies as a normal part of life in America.

As Superintendents of the public schools in Gratiot and Isabella Counties, we believe it is important for you to know we are diligently working to prevent school shootings and other types of violence in our schools. Over the past few years, our schools have participated in multiple trainings and built strong and supportive relationships with law enforcement and other first responders. They have advised us on how to better secure our schools in a variety of ways. For example, across our counties we have limited access to buildings, secured entries, and added additional security cameras. We know that students learn best in safe and secure environments.

We cannot keep our schools safe without the help and support of our entire community. We urge you to learn about the warning signs connected with school shooters in the United States. They include violent fantasies, anger problems, fascination with weapons, being a loner, suicidal or homicidal ideation, stalking, interest in previous shootings, paranoia, violence and cruelty, acting out, police contact, mental health issues, use of alcohol and drugs, and unusual interest in police, military, and terrorist activities. Experts say a single warning sign by itself might not be significant, but a cluster of warning signs is much more serious.

Please make sure your child knows they must tell a trusted adult immediately if they feel their school is threatened in any way. This includes sharing information about weapons or threatening acts of violence in person or online.

Finally, we need your support in helping our children cope with the painful feelings that may be triggered by last week's tragedy in Florida. The National Association of School Psychologists has provided tips for parents. Help your child express their feelings by making the time to ask them questions, listen, and then help them process by pointing out safeguards and what to do during an emergency.

Across Gratiot and Isabella Counties, please know that we stand united as a community against all acts of violence.

We are stronger and safer when we work together as students, parents, staff, and community members.

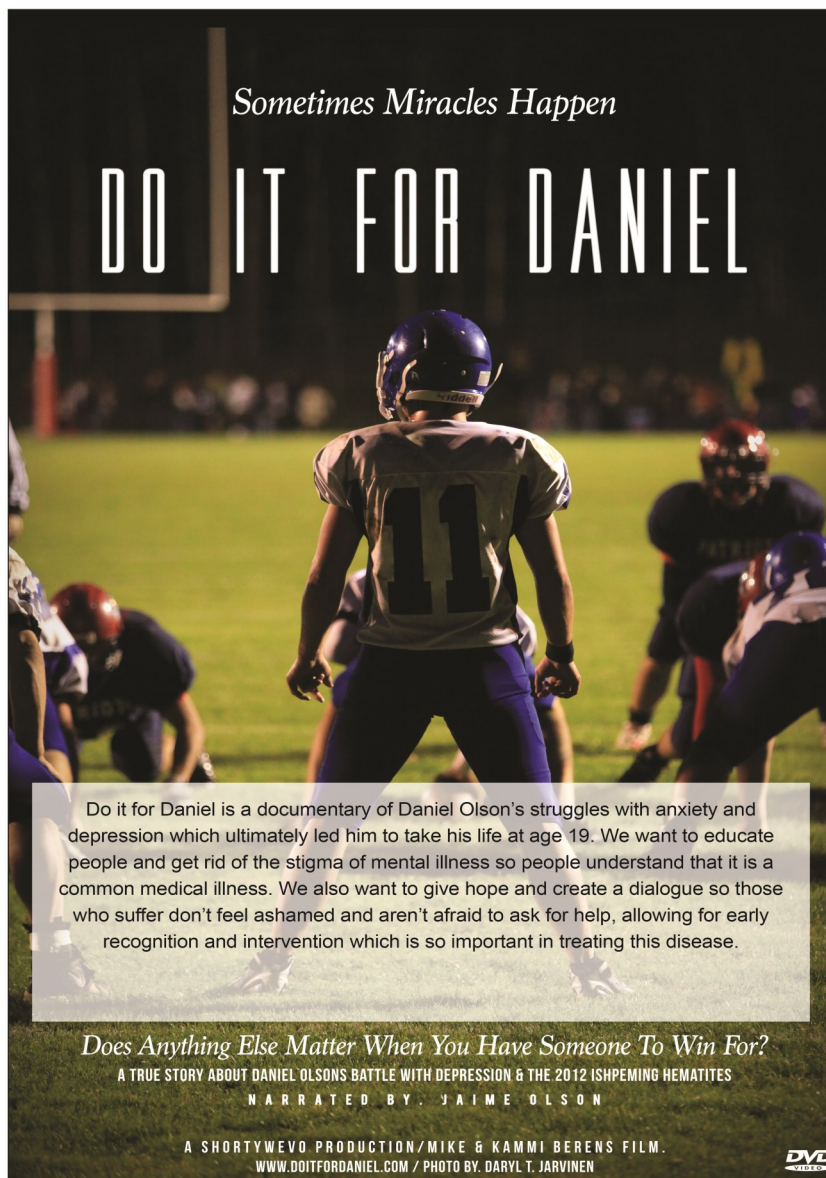

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Do it for Daniel

Do it for Daniel is a film that documents Daniel Olson's story. Daniel was an all-state quarterback for the Ishpeming (Michigan) football team, had a great family and had great friends. At age 19, he lost his life-long battle of anxiety and depression.

The Olson's family mission is to tell their family story, hoping to get rid of the stigma of mental illness so it is common for people who struggle and/or suffer to come forward and seek help. The documentary was created to educate people about the impact depression, anxiety, and other mental illnesses have on people and their families and to create a dialogue. We believe that through education, we can help stop the stigma. People who suffer from these "Medical" illnesses will feel less isolated and more willing to seek help. This documentary tells the incredible story of Daniel and his family and how the community of Ishpeming through the Hematite football team rallied to restore hope for all who suffer from this Medical illness called de-

pression.

Statistics show that one in four adults suffer from mental illness. One in four youth ages 13 to 18 experience mental disorders and most will not ask for help because of the stigma that you're weak, crazy, or faking something. 90% of suicides are from people who suffer from some sort of mental illness. To decrease suicide we need to treat the source. Anxiety and depression are the most common. We want to try to define it, help others understand what it feels like to suffer from it, and most importantly give people HOPE. It is a common Medical illness that can be treated.

Our wish is that this movie will also show the power of love, strength, and determination. The Ishpeming community rallied behind a dark situation and banded together to overcome the odds and grew together off the field as much as they did on. If we all as a team and greater community believe and work hard enough, anything is possible. We want everyone to understand, THERE IS ALWAYS HOPE and you are not alone.
